Candlemas

Malachi 3.1-5 Psalm 24.[1-6]7-end Hebrews 2.14-end Luke 2.22-40

Here we have a feast with at least three titles; the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Presentation of Christ in the Temple, popularly known as Candlemas. On this day we come to the end of the Christmas cycle, the whole Advent and Epiphany sequence about Jesus coming to us and being shown to the whole world.

So it is that we have a final emphasis on the light motif of the Christmas feasts – hence the blessing and distribution of candles, perhaps with a procession.

The infant Jesus is brought to the Temple. Three ceremonies are mentioned: the purification of the mother, the redemption of the first born, and the presentation of a child to the service of God. The commentaries tell us that Luke's account of Jewish ritual is a little bit confused, but the important thing is that there is a meeting of the old and new dispensations in Simeon and Jesus.

This is a theme which runs right through Luke's infancy narratives with the Magnificat, the Benedictus and here the Nunc Dimittis. The gospel message is transmitted in poetic style derived from the Jewish scriptures, which has wonderfully enriched Christian worship through many centuries. Jesus is linked with the Temple and with the prophetic tradition of Israel, making it clear that tradition is fulfilled in him.

Here now, in the Temple, we find true representatives of that tradition. Not the great and the powerful, but the old and the weary. They are the prayerful waiting ones. And they do three things:

- they recognise him: 'my eyes have seen your salvation.'
- they acknowledge that he will bring division: 'a sign that will be opposed ...'
- they see the universal and inclusive scope of what's happening: 'a light for revelation to the Gentiles ...'

Luke sets all this in the humility of a human story of a child and his parents. But the theme is massive: the divine theme of God working through and loving in Christ. In Christ, God is reaching out, to humanity and to all creation, with an inclusive, gracious and generous wide embrace.

In the final song of his story of Christ's infancy, Luke has Simeon proclaim just how far and wide God is reaching through Jesus – even as far as us. Yes, even as far as me, with all my faults and failings and sins – a long way.

Jesus is for all people: a light to reveal God to all nations. God's salvation comes with this little child Simeon takes in his arms. It is real, but it only comes about as expectations are upturned and re-formed, as our confidence and security are challenged.



Even (and especially) Mary will be pierced by the sword of suffering and judgement as she is pressed to a deeper and deeper understanding of what it means to have Jesus happening in her life.

There is a cost. So now we turn the page and move on beyond Christmas to its inevitable repercussions, towards Lent and the events of the Passion.

And now we too are called, like Simeon and Anna, to recognise him. To acknowledge that he cuts deep into our lives and preconceptions. To try to see just how far and wide and *indiscriminately* his mercy flows. To understand that it flows to those towards whom we struggle, and often fail, to show mercy ourselves.
